

IMC WIZARDS SHINE IN 2016 MATH CHALLENGE

Two teams from IMC Diego Silang soared high during the 2016 Metrobank-MTAP-DepEd Math Challenge (MMC) Regional Team Finals held on February 29, 2016 at Rizal High School in Pasig.

Among the 12 private and public schools, the Grade 1 Team which is composed of Tyrone Lemuel Cabiao, Jia Ruth Lauren Condino, and Djiren Riel Abdao, together with their coach T. Lolly M. Hidalgo, won 3rd place while the Grade 5 Team which is composed of Jonathan Gabriel T. Cuadro, Mickaela A. Aspuria, and Elijah Gabriel T. Protasio, together with their coach T. Jaycent Bancud, ranked 6th. Meanwhile, Tyrone Lemuel Cabiao won 9th place in the Individual Regional Competition.

The Grade 1 Team competed with the other teams coming from Saint Jude Catholic School, San Beda College, University of the Philippines Integrated School, and Xavier School. On the other hand, The Grade 5 Team fought against teams from Ateneo de Manila University, Grace Christian College, MGC New Life Christian Academy, among other schools.

These teams' journey to regionals was no small feat for they had to beat other schools in a series of eliminations which began on January.

The Grade 1 Team won 1^{st} place out of 14 competing private schools in the Sectoral Level held on February 9 at Pinaglabanan Elementary School in San Juan. Cabiao placed 6^{th} while Condino placed 7^{th} in the Individual Sectoral Finals.

While on February 4, the IMC pupils competed in the Area Team Finals at Treston International College in BGC, Taguig where they won 2nd Place. Among the 13 private schools in NCR that competed, the following members were all merit awardees in the individual category:

Cabiao (Grade 1, 1st Honors), Condino (Grade 1, 2nd Honors), and Abdao (Grade 1, 3rd Honors), Samantha Mhykhyle Francisco (Grade 3, 1st Honors), Jarvey Meejel London (Grade 4, 2nd Honors) Katrina Dela Rama (Grade 4, 2nd Honors), Jonathan Gabriel T. Cuadro, (Grade 5, 3rd Honors), Aaron Drin S. Magpantay Grade 6, 3rd Honors), Pia Elaine Morales (Grade 6, 2nd Honors) and Leonabelle Espejo (Grade 6, 2nd Honors)

In the Sectoral Individual Category held at San Francisco High School in Cubao, Quezon City, Jarvey Meejel London ranked $9^{\rm th}$ while Katrina Dela Rama ranked $10^{\rm th}$ among the fourth graders who joined. Moreover, Samantha Mykhyle Francisco ranked $10^{\rm th}$ among the third graders who participated.

Tracing back the first elimination held at R.P. Cruz Elementary School on January 14, the Grade 1 Team won $1^{\rm st}$ place Grade 2 won $2^{\rm nd}$ place, Grade 3 Team won 2nd place, Grade 4 Team won $1^{\rm st}$, Grade 5 Team placed $2^{\rm nd}$ and Grade 6 ranked $2^{\rm nd}$ after competing with other schools in Taguig.

The 2016 Metrobank-MTAP-DepEd Math Challenge(MMC) is organized by Mathematics Teachers Association of the Philippines (MTAP), the Metrobank Foundation Inc. (MBFI), and Department of Education (DepEd). On its 15th year of nationwide competition, it continues to contribute in the improvement of quality of Mathematics Education in the country.




